

EXHIBITIONS in the GALLERY



ART IN CONFLICT



On view until 2 February 2025

Art in Conflict is a touring exhibition of contemporary art from the Australian War Memorial. With widespread acclaim and more than 50,000 people visiting since the tour opening at Shepparton Art Museum in 2022, the exhibition tour has been extended to tour extensively across Australia.

A showcase of responses to war, the exhibition includes more than 70 paintings, drawings, films, prints, photography and sculptures. Leading Australian artists are represented, such as Khadim Ali, Rushdi Anwar, eX de Medici, Denise Green, Richard





Lewer, Mike Parr, and Ben Quilty. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art is featured, with works by Tony Albert, Paddy Bedford, Robert Campbell Jr, Michael Cook, Shirley Macnamara, and Betty Muffler.

Three major new bodies of work debut in this exhibition: official war art commissions by Susan Norrie (Iraq, 2016) and Megan Cope (Middle East, 2017), and a commemorative work by Angelica Mesiti.

Contemporary artists' responses to conflict bring to light untold stories, reveal neglected histories and deepen our understanding of Australia's experience of conflict, both past and present.

THE HIDDEN THEATRE Tim Georgeson and William Barton

Opening 7 February, 6pm Special performance by William Barton

On view: 8 February to 13 April

The Hidden Theatre is a sound and film installation by Australian filmmaker and artist Tim Georgeson and composer, performer and proud Kalkadunga man, William Barton. It offers a personal account of the Bundanon land and waterscapes in New South Wales, Australia.

Working together for the first time, Georgeson and Barton undertook an artistic residency at Bundanon in 2021, composing, recording and experimenting in response to Wodi Wodi Country. They continued this close collaboration offsite, weaving together their responses through an ongoing exchange of material.

Anchored by Barton's compositions, Georgeson's films are edited in distinct acts, revealing unseen interactions between sunlight, moonlight, fog and wind. Together, sound and image form a meditation on the ancient knowledge and histories held within the earth, water and skies of this place.

The Hidden Theatre is accompanied by a selection of Georgeson's photographs that capture the immediacy of the natural phenomena experienced at Bundanon.



We offer encouragement and inclusion of all skill sets, as well as safe guided instructions for those who would like it.


About Carly Marchment:

From ancient landscapes of sea, rock and sky to the microscopic patterns and rhythms that power existence, her work moves between the micro and the macro in a formative dance.

WATERCOLOUR, GOUACHE AND GRAPHITE MASTERCLASS WITH ARTIST STU DOHERTY

Join local artist Stu Doherty in a watercolour masterclass learning to paint sculptural Banksia branches with the addition of gouache and graphite pencil.

Stu's detailed watercolour paintings are calm and mesmerising, they glorify the beauty of native plants in delicate detail and colour.

Watercolour can take years to master, and during this class Stu will share his wealth of knowledge and passion for this unpredictable medium with practical demonstrations and exercises.

Unleash your creativity as you dive into the soothing flow of pigment and water on paper under Stu's expert guidance. From delicate washes to wet-in-wet, you'll learn the secrets of layering, blending, adding gouache, and creating textures with graphite, taking your skills to new heights while painting a local specimen of Banksia.



About Stu Doherty

Port Macquarie is home to Australian artist Stu Doherty, the land of the Biripi people inspires and directs his gentle watercolour practice. Born in Camden, south west of Sydney, and studying at East Sydney Technical College in the late 90's, Stu has always drawn inspiration from his natural surroundings.

An essential element of Doherty's creative process is being physically present in the landscape, where he spends time walking, collecting objects and photographing daily. These collected items and photographs become the foundation of his studio work, serving as inspiration for quick watercolour studies and texture experiments that then inform and direct his larger finished works on paper.
