

## The Hidden Theatre

The Hidden Theatre is an immersive work of sound and vision, first conceived and created in residence at Bundanon in 2021. This exhibition continues this exploration with new adaptations filled with striking images of shadows and light. Together, sound and image form a meditation of the ancient knowledge and histories held within the earth, water and skies in response to time spent in Wodi Wodi Country.

This exhibition is a collaborative project between celebrated Australian filmmaker and artist Tim Georgeson and leading composer, performer and proud Kalkadunga man, William Barton. It offers a personal account of the Bundanon land and waterscapes through film, installation and sound.

Working together for the first time, Barton and Georgeson undertook an artistic residency together, composing, recording and experimenting in response to Wodi Wodi Country. They continued this close collaboration offsite, weaving together their responses through an ongoing exchange of material. Anchored by Barton's compositions, Georgeson's films are edited in distinct acts, revealing unseen interactions between sunlight, moonlight, fog and wind. Together, sound and image form a meditation on the ancient knowledge and histories held within the earth, water and skies of this place.

## Hidden Theatre

is a haunting meditation on the unvarnished power and beauty of the landscape despite this damaging history of colonisation that created the so-called Australia. That which is hidden in this immersive forestw - spiritual entities that live on Country, including ancestors, tree spirits, fog nymphs, animal voices - are heard and become visible through connection and exchange. The result is a unique collaboration between an Indigenous artist and non - Indigenous artist whose work offers creative strategies for decolonising the land and the way is has been framed by the European settler imagination.

# Tim Georgeson

Tim Georgeson is a multidisciplinary visual artist working in the mediums of film, photography and sound with a strong focus on environment/climate justice/culture and knowledge. He creates immersive cinematic spaces where environments and bodies are transformed through the gaze of unexpected visual-musical ecologies. His creative insight into the human condition gives his work a unique identity at the boundaries of art and documentary, where his film and photography capture complex dynamics in contemporary life and merge these moments with musical design and storytelling.

A self-titled 'settler artist', he is known for his ground-breaking collaborations, most notably with Australian Indigenous artists. In 2023 Georgeson travelled deep into the Tanami Desert with a group of Karrinyarra elders to create an extraordinary multi cinematic artwork, commissioned by Glen Isegar-Pilkington, curator at the Fremantle Arts Centre and the Indigenous Desert Alliance. This was presented as part of the *Polarity Fire and Ice* exhibition at the 2024 Perth Festival. Georgeson first collaborated with William Barton in 2021 on *The Hidden Theatre*, a major three channel film and sound installation commissioned by Sophie O'Brien and Rachel Kent for the Bundanon Art Trust Art Museum. His partnership with Barton has continued on multiple works most recently *URRITJARA* an installation responding to Barton and Veronique Serret's composition Kalkarni and featuring performer Derik Lynch. *URRITJARRA* has been presented in multiple locations around Australia including Tweed Regional Gallery and Passage Gallery, Sydney.

Georgeson has won World Press Photo, Leica Camera, Cannes, Global Oceanic, Ciclope and National Geographic awards. He has exhibited in solo and group exhibitions in France, UK, Japan, Holland, Canada, the USA and Australia. His work is held in the collections of the National Portrait Gallery of Australia, Bundanon Trust Art Museum, The Australian Museum, corporate collections and regional galleries around Australia and private collections internationally.

Georgeson is represented by Olsen Gallery.









William Barton is Australia's leading didgeridoo player as well as a highly esteemed composer, instrumentalist and vocalist.

William first learnt the instrument from his uncle, Arthur Peterson, an Elder of the Wannyi, Lardil and Kalkadunga people and was working from an early age with traditional dance groups, fusion/rock/jazz bands, orchestras, string quartets and mixed ensembles.

Throughout his diverse career he has forged a path in the classical musical world from the London, Berlin and Bremer Philharmonic Orchestras to historic events at Westminster Abbey for Commonwealth Day 2019, at Anzac Cove in Gallipoli and the Beijing Olympics.

His awards include Winner of Best Original Score for a Mainstage Production at the 2018 Sydney Theatre Awards and Winner of Best Classical Album with an ARIA for Birdsong At Dusk in 2012. In 2021 he was the recipient of the prestigious Don Banks Music Award from the Australia Council and the Limelight Australian Artist of the Year: Critic's Choice. In 2022 he was included in The Australian's The List: 100 Arts & Culture influencers.






Ancient Breaths, 2024, 8 panels, dye sublimation prints on transparent voile made from recycled plastic






Theatre 20, 2022, archival pigment ink prints on Canson Platine Fibre Rag 310gsm





Moon Frequency, 2023. Duration: 10:03 Minutes. 1 channel film and sound environment.






